Course Description

Course will include a review of the definition and purpose of clinical supervision as well as models of supervision, including: Developmental, Social Role Models and models grounded in Psychotherapy. Methods and techniques of Supervision, including creative interventions will be examined. Documentation and evaluation (both supervisor and supervisee) will be discussed. Course provides 3-hours of Ethics specific to clinical supervision, including topics: multiple relationships, informed consent, competence, and malpractice. ACA Code of Ethics (2014) and the Best Practices in Clinical Supervision guidelines (2011) will be infused throughout. This course will meet six (6) hours of continuing education in Advanced Supervisor training as approved by the Board of Professional Counselors and Marriage and Family Therapists.

Methods of Instruction

Instructional procedures will consist of lecture, case study, video, and group discussion.

2. Participants will understand common ethical issues in supervision.
3. Participants will understand models, methods and techniques of supervision.
